- 9) That these truths may erase other beliefs and view in favor of it's own matrix—the right one
- 10) That these truths may require something of us—even faith as it continues to reveal itself to us
- 11) That these truths may bring a sword: in other words, separate you from others
- 12) That the truths of the Bible may not be what you expect them to be—but they are still the truth
- 13) That these truths may not be familiar in the sense of the many other things that you already know and accept
- 14) That these truths may not be familiar as what you have come to believe these things to be
- 15) That these truths may be subjected to rigorous, even empirical testing—and not fail the test
- 16) That these truths may require us to reach back as it beckons—and declare ourselves
- 17) That these truths may be challenged by others routinely and incessantly—and illogically
- 18) That these truths are timeless, dimensionless, dimensional, and quantum—they are inescapable
- 19) That these truths bring light to a world which may even shield its eyes from its relentless brilliance
- 20) That these truths will ultimately set all of us free from our captivity in sin, the task of which was adjudicated by Jesus Christ Himself—in spite of our nature and ourselves, for our sakes
